I am inspired by their stories and strive to capture those narrative moments in the lives of my subjects that are simple but cherished. I specialize in bronzes that are representational in style. My sculptures are most noted for their faces as I strive to capture the inner spirits of my subjects and transform them into clay and then bronze.

Kathy Anderson grew up in Colorado Springs, the only daughter with four brothers, a physician father and an artistic, community-volunteer mother. She learned at an early stage in her life to value her creative talents. Kathy earned her BFA degree from the University of Denver in 1964 and a Master's Degree in Art Education from the University of Oregon. In 2002, she received the Jefferson County Good News Coalition award for inspiring creativity through the arts. She began sculpting classes in the early 1990's and knew immediately that this would be a major calling in her life. Kathy's sculptures are now offered in select galleries and private collections around the world. Her work has been featured in group shows in museums, the CM Russell Museum, the Phippen Museum, and the Foothills Art Center in Golden, CO as well as many national juried and invitational exhibitions, including the Loveland Sculpture Invitational, Loveland, CO, the Fine Arts Festival in Oklahoma City, the Danada Sculpture Show in Wheaton, IL, and the Art on the Commons in Lakewood, CO. She is a proud member of Women Artists of the West. Her studio is in Littleton, CO.
